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## Narrative

Beaufort County Sheriff's Office  
Investigation Narrative

### Synopsis:

On 02/24/2019 at approximately 0226 hours BCSO received a report of a Water Emergency in Archers Creek.

### General:

Dispatch advised that there were six people on board the boat but one female was still missing and unaccounted for. While en-route the USCG, DNR, Beaufort Marine Rescue, EMS and Fire Department were summoned.

### Officers Actions / Observations:

I responded to the RC Berkeley Bridge on Malecon Dr. Parris Island, SC 29935. I located a 17ft Sea Hunt beached under the bridge with one female, Morgan Doughty sitting inside bleeding from her hand. Keith Cook, Connor Cook, Miley Altman and Paul Murdaugh were located on the bank by the boat. It was learned that Mallory Beach was still unaccounted for and in the water and did not have a life jacket on. BCSO and PMO walked the bank searching for Beach but were unable to locate her.

Through speaking with the occupants I was able to ascertain that they left the downtown day dock and were on the way back home. They took Archers Creek to cut through to the Broad River when they struck a piling at the RC Berkeley Bridge. After hitting the piling the boat was turned to the right and beached itself at the base of the bridge. During the collision with the piling, Mallory Beach was ejected from the boat into the water. Connor Cook also sustained a laceration to his jaw and Morgan Doughty sustained a laceration to her hand. The other three occupants also sustained minor injuries/cuts. Connor Cook, Miley Altman, Paul Murdaugh and Morgan Doughty were transported to Beaufort Memorial Hospital by EMS. Kevin Cook declined to be transported. It is unclear at this time whether Connor Cook or Paul Murdaugh was driving the boat. All occupants of the boat were under age and were intoxicated.

SSgt Malphrus also responded and made notifications to the command duty. After DNR arrived, the scene was turned over to them. At this time Mallory Beach has not been located.

### General Information:

On 02/24/2019 at approximately 0226 hours, BCSO responded to Archers Creek at the R. C. Berkeley Bridge aboard Parris Island Recruit Depot, South Carolina in reference to a Water Emergency.

### Officer's Observations / Actions:

While responding to the scene, Dispatch advised a boat containing six occupants had struck the bridge and one nineteen year old female was unaccounted for. Upon arriving on scene, I only observed one white male with an apparent laceration to the lip area and one female standing at the base of the bridge.

Cpl Keener and I ran under the bridge where we observed the boat on the bank. I noted the boat had damage to its front left side. I observed a white female (Morgan Doughty) sitting in the boat. Cpl Keener and I began walking along the edge of Archers Creek attempting to locate the missing female; however, we could not see or hear her.

I returned to the boat and waited with Morgan Doughty (bleeding from her hand) for EMS to arrive.

I did not conduct any interviews pertaining to the events leading up to the boat accident. I noted no statements were made by Morgan Doughty or others that indicated she ever operated the boat. She was then transported to Beaufort Memorial Hospital (955 Ribaut Road) for treatment.

Upon returning to the roadway, I noted a white male, one Keith Anthony Cook (one of the occupants) was in contact with law enforcement. I then crossed the bridge and walked along the opposite shoreline; however, I found no sign of the missing person.

Marine Corps Recruit Depot's Provost Marshal's Office, Port Royal PD and SCDNR responded to the scene. Port Royal PD assumed the missing person investigation, and DNR assumed the boat accident investigation.

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## Supplement

On February 24th (Monday) 2019 at approximately 0226 hrs, BSCO received a call in reference to a water emergency in Archers Creek. Upon arriving on scene at approximately 0240 hrs, I observed a white male, later identified as Keith Cook, Jr. wearing only blue jeans and boots, walking on top of the RC Berkeley Bridge located on Malacon Drive. I heard Keith crying and yelling "Mallory" over and over again as he was walking down the bridge toward me. I made contact with Keith and conducted a field interview with him.

Interview with Keith Cook, Jr.

While speaking with Keith, I could tell that he was in shock and was only worried about finding his girlfriend. After walking with Keith back and forth, I was finally able to calm him down enough to get some information from him in regards to the incident. Keith stated that he and some friends were out in the river all day drinking. Later in the evening, they docked at the day dock downtown Beaufort. Keith stated that he and his girlfriend, Mallory, stayed on the boat while the rest of his friends went on land to drink some more. Once they returned to the boat, Keith stated that he begged Paul Murdaugh, who was driving the boat at the time of the incident, to please let him drive because he was too intoxicated to drive. Keith stated that Paul refused to let him drive. Keith stated that once they entered Archers Creek, he sat on the bottom of the boat and had Mallory sit in his lap to hold on because Paul was going too fast. The next thing that Keith remembered was not too long after he and Mallory were sitting in the bottom of the boat, he was in the water after the boat struck the bridge. Keith stated that he swam around for about twenty minutes looking for Mallory, yelling her name over and over but could not locate her. Keith stated that he and his friends involved in the accident looked around for Mallory before they called 911. Keith stated that Paul Murdaugh was last seen driving the boat right before they crashed into the bridge.

Officers Notes:

While speaking with Keith, I was able to get him calm enough to sit in the back of my patrol vehicle to keep warm with the door opened. While talking with Keith, he observed Paul Murdaugh walking toward our direction. Keith immediately became irate, yelling and cussing at Paul as he was walking by. Keith identified Paul once again as the male driving the boat and notated again that Paul was very intoxicated and should have not been driving the boat.

I sat with Keith keeping him company until his family arrived from Hampton County. I advised Dispatch at approximately 0314 hours that my boy mic died.

Reference A:

On 02/24/2019 at approximately 0226 hours, BCSO received a report of a Water Emergency in Archers Creek.

Deputy's Actions:

When I arrived on scene, I reported in to Sgt Krapf who was already on scene and asked where I was needed. He told me to stay with 3 of the 4 kids that were already out of the boat on land, among the 3 were Connor Cook, Paul Murdaugh, and Miley Altman. I was informed by EMS that they needed the 3 to get into one of the two ambulances so that they could be transported to Beaufort Memorial Hospital, in order to be treated. Once the subjects were in the ambulance, Murdaugh became very uncooperative and almost aggressive towards EMS personnel. At that time, EMS requested that I ride to BMH with them to ensure the safety of the patients and themselves. During the ride to BMH, no information about the case was obtained. The only thing the subjects were saying during the ride was requesting to know if their friend had been found yet.

Supplemental Narrative

### Synopsis:

On 02/24/2019 at approximately 0226, BCSO responded to the RC Berkeley Bridge at Archers Creek in reference to a Boat Accident / Water Emergency. One out of the six passengers was missing and unaccounted for.

### Officers Actions / Observations:

After arriving on scene, I was met by Connor Cook, Miley Altman and Paul Murdaugh at the base of the bridge standing together. I spoke with the three briefly to get the name and clothing description of Mallory Beach, the missing occupant. I then relayed to dispatch the missing occupant of the vessel was Mallory Beach, she had blond hair and was last seen wearing a pink shirt, blue jeans and was not wearing a life jacket. As we walked down to the base of the bridge, PMO stopped at the boat with Morgan Doughty who was bleeding from her hand. Sgt Krapf and I searched the area of the shoreline on either side of the bridge down current but were unable to locate her. After walking approximately 100 yards west down the creek towards the Broad River, the pluff mud was too soft to walk on anymore. While searching the area, I was able to follow a blood trail and foot prints from one of the other occupants. It led from the boat, under the bridge and out into the marsh, as if one of them had already been out looking for Mallory Beach. Once back at the boat, I noted that Morgan Doughty appeared to be in shock from the accident and from the wound on her hand that was still bleeding.

After going back up the hill, another PMO Officer was talking to Connor Cook, Miley Altman and Paul Murdaugh. While trying to obtain their information, I witnessed Paul Murdaugh on a phone call talking to someone. Paul appeared to be highly intoxicated and was only wearing boxers. While on the phone talking to an unknown individual, I heard him say something to the effect of, "We were runnin' hard and hit the Lemon Island / Callawassie Bridge. Mallory is gone and we can't find her", as he started to sob.

I briefly spoke with Connor Cook and Miley Altman in an attempt to get some more details, while Paul Murdaugh was on the phone standing beside them.

### Interview with Connor Cook and Miley Altman:

They advised that they had gone to the day dock in downtown Beaufort that evening. They then left and were on the way home when they hit the piling. After they hit the piling, they attempted to search the area for Mallory Beach but were unable to locate her. After approximately 20 minutes, they called 911 for help. When asked who was driving, they stated they did not know.

### Officers Actions / Observations:

I noted that the boat was completely beached out of the water on the rocks. The left side of the bow was damaged and had a gaping hole in it. After looking at the damage to the boat, it appeared that the boat struck the dolphin "navigation aid / cluster of pilings spaced out from the bridge to mark the channel" due to leaving a white scuff mark in it. Also, to the right of the dolphin, one of the bridge pilings appeared to me missing some barnacles.

There was also blood on the left side of the bow and gunnel of the boat, near the hole. In the back of the boat near the transom was a pool of blood. Throughout the floor were droplets of blood. Morgan Doughty was sitting on the bow facing backwards, towards the motor. She was holding her hand and had a pool of blood between her feet where it appeared she had been sitting for some time.

The foot of the motor was approximately a foot away from the water and the tide

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was still pushing out. Also, one of the blades had been broken off the prop. Due to the noise ordinance in downtown Beaufort, all bars and restaurants close down at approximately 0130 to 0200 hours. Due to personal knowledge of the waterway, it is approximately 9.5 miles by boat from downtown Beaufort to the RC Berkeley Bridge in Archers Creek and takes approximately 15 minutes to get to. This is the same time frame that is consistent with Connor's and Miley's statement of leaving the day dock in Beaufort, being involved in the collision, looking for Mallory Beach and then calling 911.

While waiting on Fire and EMS, we kept Keith Cook, Connor Cook, Miley Altman and Paul Murdaugh together on the side of the roadway. When Paul Murdaugh started to get near Keith Cook, I could see that Keith started to get loud and angry while LCpl Domino was speaking with him.

**Introduction**

On February 28, 2019, the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) received a request from the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR), to conduct an investigation regarding a boating accident in which SCDNR believed alcohol was a contributing factor (**Attachment 1**). One boat occupant, Mallory Beach, nineteen years of age, died as a result of her injuries. Five additional underage occupants were in the boat at the time of the accident. Two sustained great bodily injury, and the other three sustained minor injuries. Lieutenant (Lt.) David Leslie (SLED) assigned the investigation to Special Agent (S/A) Chandler Horney (SLED) on February 28, 2019.





### Summary

On March 4, 2019, S/A Chandler Horney, S/A Matthew Walker, and Lt. David Leslie attended a meeting at the Charleston SCDNR office to discuss the boating accident, which occurred on February 24, 2019 at approximately 2:15 am. S/A Horney received a copy of SCDNR's boating accident report #19-02-0944, written by Investigator Damian Yongue (**Attachment 2**). According to the SCDNR boating accident report, SCDNR responded to a single boat accident on February 24, 2019. Five occupants of the boat, Paul Murdaugh, Connor Cook, Anthony Cook, Morgan Doughty, and Miley Altman were found by emergency personnel on the shore of Archer's Creek with the wrecked boat. One occupant, Mallory Beach, was unaccounted for.

The five boat occupants on scene were described as underage and intoxicated at the time of the accident according to Beaufort County Sheriff's Office Incident Report 19S050424 (**Attachment 3**). Sgt. Reynard from Port Royal Police Department listed the five occupants as "grossly intoxicated" in his supplemental report (**Attachment 4**). Marine Corps Military Police Officer Carson's report stated "COOK/C, COOK/K [Anthony], ALTMAN, MURDAUGH, and DOUGHTY all appeared to be intoxicated" (**Attachment 5**). SCDNR Investigators located several empty containers of alcohol, as well as coolers with unopened alcohol, in the wreckage of the boat, as seen in SCDNR's photographic evidence log (**Attachment 6**). Doughty can be seen on BCSO bodyworn camera footage stating her boyfriend [Murdaugh] is extremely intoxicated (**Attachment 7**). Four of the other occupants were transported to Beaufort Memorial Hospital. Anthony Cook refused medical assistance and remained on scene to assist in the search for Mallory Beach. Paul Murdaugh, Miley Altman, and Anthony Cook had minor injuries. Connor Cook and Morgan Doughty sustained significant injuries as a result of the accident. EMS Personnel as well hospital staff that tended to the occupants also described their behavior as being consistent with intoxication. As part of the medical treatment received, hospital staff conducted blood draws on Paul Murdaugh and Connor Cook [several hours after the accident]. Medical records revealed that at the time of the blood draw, Paul Murdaugh's BAC was .24, and Connor Cook's was .17 (**Attachment 8-9, 51-52**). Miley Altman, Anthony Cook, and Morgan Doughty's blood was not drawn. [S/A Horney received a copy of Miley Altman and Morgan Doughty's medical records. There was nothing of

evidentiary value to SLED's investigation in these records] (**Attachments 53-54**). On April 11, 2019, Dr. Mark Mercier was interviewed by S/A Horney, Inv. Yongue, and Craig Jones [General Counsel for SCDNR]. Dr. Mercier stated he was the attending physician at Beaufort Memorial Hospital on February 24, 2019. Dr. Mercier told S/A Horney and SCDNR that a blood draw was not medically necessary for Miley Altman or Morgan Doughty, and therefore was not ordered (**Attachment 10**).

On March 3, 2019, Mallory Beach's body was discovered in the marsh by two civilians assisting in the search approximately five miles from where the collision occurred, as noted in the autopsy report from the Medical University of South Carolina [MUSC] (**Attachment 11**). The two civilians immediately contacted SCDNR and Beaufort County Sheriff's Office who recovered the body (**Attachment 3**). According to Mallory Beach's toxicology report from NMS Labs, her BAC was .155 at the time of her death (**Attachment 12**). The cause of death, according to her autopsy performed by MUSC, was drowning with a contributing factor of blunt head trauma.

SCDNR Inv. Yongue and SCDNR PFC Austin Pritcher spoke with Miley Altman and Morgan Doughty on February 25, 2019 (**Attachment 13-16**). They were consistent in saying all six individuals had been drinking at and prior to the time of the accident. Altman and Doughty advised they started drinking around 6:00 pm that evening at Paul Murdaugh's family's house, referred to as "the River House". According to Doughty's and Altman's statements, Paul Murdaugh went to Parker's 55 gas station to purchase alcohol for the group prior to 6:00pm. After getting together at "the River House", Doughty and Altman stated they went to Kristy Wood's house by way of Paul Murdaugh's family's boat to attend an oyster roast. From there, they took the boat to downtown Beaufort where two of the occupants, Paul Murdaugh and Connor Cook, went to Luther's Rare and Well Done, a bar located at 910 Bay St, Beaufort. According to information Doughty provided to Agents, Anthony Cook, Morgan Doughty, Miley Altman, and Mallory Beach all stayed on the swings near the boat landing because they did not have fake IDs. The statements made by Doughty, Altman, and Anthony Cook reported that once Murdaugh and Connor Cook returned to the boat, with Murdaugh driving, they made a few "donuts" in front of the dock before heading back to

Murdaugh's family "River house". On the way back to the house, at approximately 2:15 am, they crashed into a bridge on Archer's Creek. SCDNR also provided SLED with a copy of their interviews with Anthony Cook and Connor Cook on February 24, 2019. Those interviews did not contain information of evidentiary value for SLED's investigation (**Attachment 17-18**).

SCDNR provided SLED with written statements from initial interviews they had conducted on February 26, 2019. These interviews were conducted with Jake Price, the bouncer at the door of Luther's Rare and Well Done, and the bartender, Kayla Canavan, who were both working the night of February 23, 2019. Price was interviewed by SCDNR's Inv. Yongue. He recalled that both Paul Murdaugh and Connor Cook each handed him a horizontal SC driver's license (**Attachment 19**). In Inv. Yongue's interview with Canavan, she stated they ordered two shots when they first came in, and two more approximately ten minutes after that. Canavan mentioned they were already intoxicated when they arrived. She stated Paul Murdaugh asked if she would let their underage friends in, which she refused (**Attachment 20**).

At approximately 11:45 am on March 5, 2019, S/A Horney and S/A Walker arrived at Parker's 55 in order to pick up video surveillance footage. The manager at that location, Quanna, informed S/A Horney they were still waiting on the footage from their main office in Savannah, but she provided S/A Horney with a receipt of transaction number 3353268 from 5:33 pm on February 23, 2019 (**Attachment 21**). The Parker's 55 receipt showed Murdaugh purchased a 6 pack of Michelob Ultra Lime 12 oz cans, a 12 pack variety pack of White Claw, a 15 pack of Natural Light 12 oz cans, as well as a pack of cigarettes and a pack of gum. S/A Horney returned to Parker's 55 on March 11, 2019 and was able to obtain a copy of the surveillance footage. Parker's surveillance video showed Murdaugh entering the store, purchasing alcohol, cigarettes, and gum, and handing the cashier a horizontal SC ID that the cashier scanned, and returned as a valid ID. From the outer camera angle provided by Parker's Loss Prevention office, Paul Murdaugh can be seen putting the alcohol onto the boat, trailered to his vehicle (**Attachment 22, 55**). S/A Horney attempted to call Parker's Loss Prevention office four times in order to see if they had a record of what ID was scanned the afternoon of February 23, 2019. S/A Horney left

two messages between March 30 and April 3, and received a call back on April 5, 2019. S/A Horney was contacted by Parker's attorney, Mitch Griffith, whom S/A Horney met with on April 4, 2019. [Griffith contacted S/A Horney on an unrelated matter, but Griffith provided S/A Horney with the information sought from Parker's Loss Prevention]. Mitch Griffith informed S/A Horney Parker's did not hold the names from scanned ID's, but the date of birth was retained. The date of birth from the ID scanned was [REDACTED] 1996. Griffith gave S/A Horney a printout of the information scanned (**Attachment 23**).

On March 5, 2019, at approximately 12:30 pm S/A Horney and S/A Walker met with Michael Stavac, the manager of Luther's Rare and Well Done, located at 910 Bay St. in Beaufort, in order to obtain surveillance video and receipts from the night of the accident. Agents were able to view the video on that day, and SA Horney received a burned copy from Stavac on March 13, 2019. The surveillance video obtained showed Paul Murdaugh and Connor Cook enter the location shortly before 1:00 am. The bouncer at the door, identified as Jake Price, can be seen requesting both of their identifications. Upon checking their ID's, he let them enter the bar. They purchased two liquor shots "jaeger bombs" and two liquor shots "lemon drops" from the bartender, identified as Kayla Canavan, at approximately 12:58 am as seen on the receipts (**Attachment 24**). They paid for their alcohol and left the bar at approximately 1:07 am as seen on Luther's Rare and Well Done security footage (**Attachment 25, 57**).

On March 6, 2019 at 10:45 am, Inv. Yongue, Inv. Brock, and S/A Horney met at the accident location on Archer's Creek to meet with Connor Cook, Anthony Cook, Morgan Doughty, and Miley Altman to discuss the accident and conduct further interviews. At approximately 12:30 pm, Inv. Yongue made contact with Morgan Doughty by telephone who stated none of them were coming to the interview. Inv. Yongue rescheduled the interview for March 8, 2019. On March 8, 2019 at approximately 12:00 pm, Inv. Yongue, Inv. Brock, and S/A Horney again met in order to re-interview the occupants of the boat. Once again, they failed to attend the scheduled interview. Inv. Yongue made contact with Anthony Cook by phone, who stated his cousin Connor Cook was not driving the boat at the time of the accident, and that Connor Cook had personally told him this. Anthony

Cook further stated that once he gave Inv. Yongue his written statement, he did not want anything more to do with the investigation (**Attachment 26, 27**).

On March 6, 2019 at 5:00 pm, Inv. Yongue, Inv. Brock, and S/A Horney conducted several interviews with Beaufort Memorial Hospital staff who had been on duty February 24, 2019 (**Attachment 28-37**). They interviewed Scott Jones, a security guard posted outside Paul Murdaugh's room, Karen Taylor, Paul Murdaugh's nurse, and Elizabeth Warren McAlhaney, Connor Cook's nurse. Scott Jones stated Murdaugh's grandfather said "he's drunker than Cooter Brown" in reference to Paul Murdaugh. Jones stated Murdaugh was acting intoxicated, but he did not get close enough to smell alcohol (**Attachment 28**). Karen Taylor, Murdaugh's nurse, stated he was grossly intoxicated and told her he had been drinking and doing drugs all night long (**Attachment 29**). Elizabeth Warren McAlhaney, Cook's nurse, stated Connor Cook smelled strongly of alcohol, and admitted to drinking (**Attachment 30**). S/A Horney obtained the footage from the hospital the morning of February 23, 2019. There was nothing of evidentiary value to SLED's investigation found on this footage (**Attachment 59**).

SLED was notified by SCDNR investigators that Connor Cook, Morgan Doughty and Miley Altman had retained attorneys. Morgan Doughty and Miley Altman had both retained Attorney Mark Tinsley.

On March 7, 2019 at approximately 12:00 pm, S/A Horney arrived at the Beaufort Police Department (BPD) to meet with Captain George Erdel in order to see if BPD had footage from the "day dock" in downtown Beaufort. BPD had several cameras in that area. S/A Horney and Captain Erdel reviewed the footage showing the boat's arrival to, and departure from, the downtown area. This video showed Paul Murdaugh and Connor Cook as the only occupants who approached the bar area (**Attachment 38, 56**). As they were walking back to the boat, Paul Murdaugh can be seen stumbling. S/A Horney received a copy of this footage from BPD.

Based upon statements made by Doughty and in reference to occupants attending an oyster roast, agents made contact with Kristy Woods to conduct an interview. On March

11, 2019 at approximately 3:30 pm, S/A Horney and S/A Walker arrived at the Wood's house at [REDACTED] Beaufort, SC 29906. Kristy Woods stated to agents that she only saw Miley Altman with a beverage in her hand, but Altman immediately discarded the can due to her parents' attendance at the oyster roast. Wood never saw any other occupants with alcohol in their hands and stated that no alcohol was provided or available at the party (**Attachment 39-41**). [Agent's Note: According to Doughty and Wood's statements to Agents, occupants of the boat left somewhere between 11:30 pm and 12:00 am and headed to downtown Beaufort].

On March 15, 2019 at approximately 3:00 pm, S/A Horney obtained search warrants for the social media accounts of all the boat occupants from the Beaufort County Magistrate's Office. On March 19, 2019, the search warrants were submitted to Facebook, Instagram, and Snapchat custodians of records. On April 18, 2019, Instagram and Facebook sent results of the search warrants to S/A Horney. On May 14, 2019, Snapchat returned results of the search warrants. Nothing of evidentiary value to SLED's investigation was discovered during the review of these social media records (**Attachment 42**).

On April 10, 2019 at 2:30 pm, S/A Horney and S/A Walker met with Morgan Doughty and her attorney, Mark Tinsley. Tinsley told agents Doughty had information on the ID Paul Murdaugh used to purchase alcohol the night of the accident. Doughty advised agents that she had accompanied Paul Murdaugh on February 8, 2019 to the Thomas Cooper Library on the University of South Carolina's campus. She was present when Paul Murdaugh met with his brother, Alexander "Buster" Murdaugh, so that Alexander Murdaugh could give Paul Murdaugh his identification. After follow up questions from Agents, Doughty stated that was not the first time the brothers had done this. She told agents Alexander Murdaugh would often give his ID to his younger brother, Paul Murdaugh, and Alexander Murdaugh would then use his passport to purchase alcohol. The reason they did this was so Paul Murdaugh could also have an over 21 ID to purchase alcohol (**Attachment 43**). According to the Department of Motor Vehicles license records, Alexander Murdaugh's date of birth is [REDACTED] 1996 (**Attachment 44**). Doughty also spoke to Agents about the party at the Wood's house. She stated that

Crystal (Kristy) Wood did not supply them with any alcohol, but was aware the underage individuals were drinking. Additionally, she stated Kristy Wood tried to stop them from leaving the party and stay at her house for the night because they were intoxicated. [Ms. Doughty gave copies of photos from her cell phone to S/A Horney showing repeated events where Murdaugh and his family were drinking, and a prior oyster roast at the Wood's house where underage individuals were drinking] (Attachment 58). Agents asked if Doughty knew what ID Connor Cook used to purchase alcohol and she stated she did not know. Agents attempted to obtain a written statement from Ms. Doughty, however her attorney Mark Tinsley would not consent to a written statement citing the fact that it would contradict her statements to DNR.

### **Conclusion**

The following statements are based upon facts obtained during the investigation:

- There was a boating accident the morning of February 24, 2019.
- There was one casualty as a result of this accident, and two instances of great bodily injury.
- The BAC results from three of the occupants show they were under the influence of alcohol at the time of the accident.
- All six of the occupants were under the age of 21.
- Statements from the occupants confirm the six occupants of the boat drank alcohol for several hours prior to the boat accident.
- There was alcohol purchased with a valid SC ID from Parker's 55 by Paul Murdaugh.
- The occupants drank alcoholic beverages at the Wood's house during the oyster roast, the Wood's did not provide the alcohol, but were aware the underage occupants were drinking.
- Photos and statements confirm Paul Murdaugh and Connor Cook purchased alcohol under the age of 21 from Luther's Rare and Well Done after IDs were checked by employees.
- Paul Murdaugh did have an ID in his possession which, when scanned at Parker's, reflected his brother Alexander Murdaugh's date of birth at the time of these events.
- It is unknown what ID Connor Cook was using to purchase alcohol at the time of these events.

- On the morning of the accident, Morgan Doughty, Miley Altman, Anthony Cook, and Connor Cook all provided SCDNR with written statements. Anthony Cook wrote a subsequent statement before refusing to cooperate further with the investigation. Morgan Doughty attended an interview with SLED, but did not provide a written statement. All other attempts to obtain statements or interview Miley Altman or Connor Cook were unsuccessful.

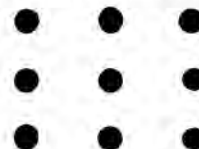

On April 10, 2019 Special Agents Chandler Horney and Matthew Walker with the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division met at the Law Offices of Tupper, Grimsley Dean and Canaday in Beaufort, SC at 2:30 pm to interview boat occupant Morgan Doughty with her attorney, Mark Tinsley present.

S/A Horney began by asking how Morgan was feeling and how her hand was doing. She showed Agents her hand, explaining that her fingers were crooked and were unable to straighten or have much movement. She has an appointment with a doctor soon, and may have to have additional surgery on the hand, she will definitely have to have physical therapy.

Doughty went on to inform agents that on February 8, 2019, she went to Columbia to meet her boyfriend, Paul Murdaugh, at the University of South Carolina. They met up with his brother, Alexander "Buster" Murdaugh at the Thomas Cooper Library on campus. At this time, Alexander gave Paul his driver's license with a birthdate of 4/11/1996. Morgan stated this was not the first time Alexander has given Paul his driver's license, and that Alexander will use his passport as identification when Paul has possession of the license. She also said his parents were aware of this, and they were only angry that Alexander would carry around his passport all the time, not that Paul was using his brother's driver's license to purchase alcohol, and they never told them not to do this. She and Paul dated for three years so she was around his family relatively frequently.

In reference to the night of the boat accident, February 23, 2019, Morgan stated she worked that day, got off at 6:00 pm and her friends were all waiting for her to get to Paul Murdaugh's house in Chechessee. They had purchased alcohol beforehand, and when she got there they had already all been drinking. By 7:00 pm they were on the boat, by 8:00 pm they had arrived at the Wood's residence for the oyster roast the Woods' were having that evening. Morgan stated she did not open the cooler so she does not know what was inside. She and Miley and Mallory all got their alcohol from the boat coolers, she does not know where the boys got their alcohol due to the fact that they had separated while at the house. She stated Kristy Woods did know that the youth were drinking, she had made comments to her daughter, Madison Woods, about being uncomfortable with the youth drinking but did not ask for it to stop. Morgan also said she had a conversation with Kristy with a drink in her hand and Kristy said nothing about it.

Around midnight they left the Woods house, she said everyone was visibly intoxicated at this point. Paul wanted to go to a bar in downtown Beaufort, Luther's. No one else

Present during the interview of Karen Taylor were SCDNR Investigator Michael Brock, SLED Agent Chandler Horney and Beaufort Memorial Compliance Officer Allison Coppage. Ms. Taylor was the nurse for Paul Murdaugh at the hospital on the night of the incident. Ms. Taylor's initial observation of Paul included that he was only wearing boxers and that he was grossly intoxicated and belligerent. Ms. Taylor stated that he appeared to be the most intoxicated and uncooperative of those involved. Ms. Taylor said that Paul was hostile and wanted to know why she was asking questions. Ms. Taylor described Paul as one of the most arrogant teenagers to come through the emergency room. According to Ms. Taylor, Paul kept saying that "Y'all should be doing your jobs and looking for my friend." Ms. Taylor said that Paul got out of the bed and disconnected the monitors at least three times. When Ms. Taylor asked Paul about his alcohol consumption he initially responded with five to six beers. He then continued with he had been drinking and doing all kinds of drugs all night. Ms. Taylor recalled that Paul would make a statement and when she would ask him about the statement he would not remember making the statement. Paul's grandfather and father arrived approximately ten minutes after Paul. Ms. Taylor stated that Paul's father asked an SCDNR officer multiple times if he had reason to believe that Paul was driving the boat.

Ms. Taylor said that Paul's grandfather remained mostly by the bedside but that Paul's father was in and out of the room. Ms. Taylor noticed that Paul's father spoke with Connor's parents and after the conversation they told Connor not to say anything. Ms. Taylor got the impression that the concern was staying out of trouble rather than what occurred. Ms. Taylor stated that Paul's father was agreeable with the physician's recommendations. Ms. Taylor did not interact with any other patients other than taking supplies to Morgan's room.

DETAILED STATEMENT OF INVESTIGATION: Officers Notes:

Dispatch advised of a water emergency regarding a boat collision that occurred on Archer's Creek near the bridge on Malecon Drive, with one passenger from the boat missing. I requested dispatch notify Marine Rescue of the incident and have them respond to Archer's Creek.

Port Royal officers, and Beaufort County Sheriffs Office deputies, responded to the bridge on Malecon Dr and made contact with the passengers from the boat. Initial information was taken by the BCSO deputies who were on scene prior to Port Royal officers. Prior to my arrival BCSO had several deputies search the bank of the water for the missing passenger, their efforts met with negative results, BCSO case #19S050424. I arrived on scene and assumed incident command. A description of the missing passenger, identified as Mallory Beach, was relayed to dispatch, and the fire department and EMS were dispatched to the scene. Contact was made with the remaining 5 passengers of the boat who had gotten ashore. I observed that all of the passengers were grossly intoxicated, I directed the BCSO deputies on scene to begin collecting information from the passengers on the boat. While speaking with the passengers BCSO deputies were unable to determine initially who the driver of the boat was, however, it was later determined that the boat was either being driven by Paul Murdaugh or Connor Cook.

I checked the scene and observed a center console fishing boat, bearing SC registration #SC6998BU on the rocks under the bridge. I observed that there was blood in the main compartment of the boat and that the left side of the boat had a large split in the hull from the impact with a pylon in the water. I used my department issued cellular telephone to photograph the scene, which are attached to this report.

DNR was contacted and requested to respond due to the collision having occurred on the water way. Parris Island PMO and The US Coast Guard was notified of the incident and requested to respond to assist in the search for the missing passenger, Parris Island PMO informed me that their fire department was putting their boat in the water to assist with the search. I observed that Marine Rescue, PMO fire department arrived on scene with their boats and began the search for the missing passenger, however, their efforts to locate the passenger were hampered by heavy fog. I was contacted by US Coast Guard who informed me that due to the heavy fog their airborne assets would not be able to launch, however, their marine assets would be arriving on scene shortly. I observed the US Coast Guard arrive on scene with their boat and informed them of the VHF radio frequency being used by Marine Rescue to assist in coordinating their search efforts. I contacted Port Royal Command Duty (Sgt Dowling) and informed him of the incident and the current search for the missing passenger. He informed me that he would begin making contact with the other command staff to inform them of the incident.

Beaufort County EMS responded to the scene and determined that the passengers of the boat required further evaluation at the Beaufort Memorial Hospital and transported them without incident, however, Keith Cook (passenger), refused transport due to the missing person being his girl friend. I was met on scene by DNR agent Henderson, who informed me that one of his agents had responded to the hospital for interviews of the passengers. I briefed Henderson of the incident and current findings, to include possible drivers of the boat, and transferred incident command to him without incident. He informed me that he was having additional DNR resources dispatched to the scene to assist with the search of the missing passenger. At approximately 0530 hours Marine Rescue determined that they were going to suspend their search for the passenger until day break. DNR agent Henderson determined that he no longer needed assistance from Port Royal and BCSO and we were released from the scene without further incident.

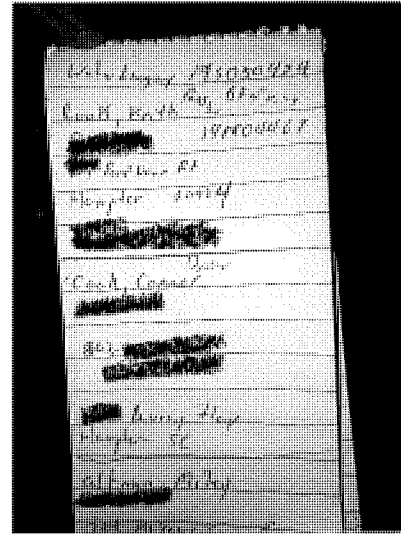

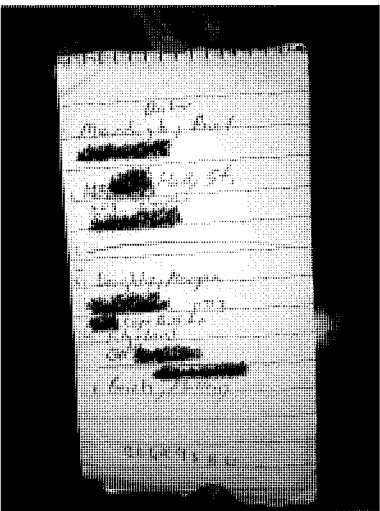



## Narrative

SSgt. Brandon Disbrow, D8767

### Synopsis:

On 02-24-19, The BCSO was asked to assist in an investigation being handled by the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR), which yield potential evidence in their investigation.

### Officer's Actions:

On 02-24-19, I, SSgt. Brandon Disbrow, was the On-Duty Investigator and received a phone call from Capt. Purdy. I was briefed on an investigation being handled by the SCDNR which involved six individuals that were involved in a boating accident, and of the six individuals involved in the accident, one was ejected and has not been located (SCDNR Case: 19-02-0944). I was informed that SCDNR Officer Michael Brock was handling the investigation and was requesting assistance with forensic processing of the boat. I also learned that the forensic processing was to focus on collecting evidence to help determine who the operator of the boat was during the accident. I was asked to meet with SCDNR Officer Brock at the Parris Island Boat Landing (21 Marina Blvd, Beaufort, SC 29902) at 1630 hrs.

At approximately 1630 hrs, I met with several SCDNR Officers at the aforementioned boat landing and viewed the boat in question. I was informed that SCDNR Officer Brock was enroute to the boat landing with a search warrant he obtained from a Magistrate. After SCDNR Officer Brock arrived we discussed the forensic processing that needed to be done. It was determined that SCDNR Officer Brock would photograph and take possession of all of the collected evidence. I was requested to fingerprint the area around the driver's seat, and then to collect DNA swabs from various locations with the focus on attempting to determine who was operating the boat.

### Fingerprint Processing:

I noted that the boat's sides around the driver's side was a coarse white plastic, and it did not appear that it would be smooth enough to yield fingerprints but it was processed anyways. I processed the driver's console, the left side of the interior portion of the boat (closest to the driver's seat), the vinyl driver's seat, the metal railing around the driver's console, the GPS, and the plexiglass windshield. I did not locate any fingerprints. There were two White Claw alcohol cans in the back of the boat, which were open and mostly empty, I processed the cans for fingerprints but did not locate any. I collected these cans as evidence (one flavor was a Black Cherry and the other was Ruby Grapefruit).

I also learned that since the boat was recovered and it was in the open air from the time of the accident until the time of the fingerprint processing. During this timeframe there were periods of rain in Beaufort County.

### DNA Processing:

There were several areas of suspected blood on the boat's surface which these areas were swabbed. I noted that the driver's seat, which was directly behind the console, could sit two people, but the steering wheel was on the left side and the throttle was situated towards the middle of the console. There was railing that went around the driver's console and it would be reasonable for a person sitting in the driver's seat to use the railing to help stand up, or to help themselves balance if the boat was in motion.

I processed the following areas for DNA (11 total): Suspected blood on exterior port side, suspected blood on trim near damage on port side, swab of

steering wheel, swab of the boat throttle, swab of the plexiglass windshield, swab of left side rail of driver's console, swab of right rail of driver's console, swab of Garmin GPS, swab of suspected blood on right side floor of boat, swab of seat in front of steering wheel, swab of right side of driver's seat.

**\*\*Note\*\***

Each swab was placed into separate small white envelopes, and then placed into a larger envelope.

I then transported all of the evidence (two alcohol cans and the eleven swabs) to the Northern Investigations Office where SCDNR Officer Brock met me. All of the evidence bags were completed and I sealed them. I then signed over all of the evidence to SCDNR Officer Brock and provided him this case number.

There was no further action by SSgt. Brandon Disbrow.

### General:

On 3/3/19 around 1335 hrs I was dispatched to a call in reference to a boater in the Broad River that located what they believed to be a female body in the marsh. Several BCSO Deputies responded. I responded to the Broad River boat landing and made contact with one of the complainants, Jennifer Campbell, and conducted an interview.

### Interview of Jennifer Campbell:

Jennifer advised her husband, Kenneth Campbell, and his brother, Keith Campbell, were out on their boat attempting to look for the missing female. She said she was supposed to meet them at the Broad River Boat Landing so they could pick her up. She then advised that when she noticed all of the law enforcement vehicles arriving that someone must have found her.

### Interview of Kenneth Campbell:

Kenneth advised that he made contact with a DNR officer that advised he was allowed to voluntarily look for the missing female. Kenneth stated he and his brother Keith launched from the Broad River Boat Landing. He said he took the first creek on the right and shortly after entering that creek his brother Keith yelled out that he could see someone laying in the marsh. Kenneth further explained that his brother Keith was sitting on the boats "T-Top" while he was driving.

Kenneth advised once he got closer he noticed what he believed to be a white female laying face down about 6 feet from the edge of the water inside the marsh line. He described a white female, covered in mud, with brown boots on and a sweater covered in mud. When asked, Kenneth advised he could not tell the color of the sweater or any other detail due to the amount of mud. Kenneth said he called 9-11 and kept his boat as close as possible until DNR responded to his location.

### Interview of Keith Campbell:

Keith advised he was on the top of his brother's boat when they left the Broad River Boat Landing. Keith stated they went into the first creek and saw the female just off the bank of the water. Keith described a female fully clothed with boots on.

### Officer Actions:

I gathered all available information. DNR Officer Pope and I arrived at the Broad River Boat Landing simultaneously. DNR advised that they had several boats in the water and were heading to Kenneth's location. DNR then requested assistance shutting down the boat landing and pier for the recovery of the found body. My supervisor was notified, responded to my location and contacted the on duty BCSO investigator and on duty command duty officer. I requested all of the people at the boat landing and pier to leave the area in reference to an ongoing investigation. All parties not directly involved left without incident and the Boat Landing was secured. I requested Kenneth and Keith to complete a written statement form to which they complied. Coroner David Ott arrived on scene shortly after along with Inv. Abell. No further actions taken.

## General:

On 3/3/19 (Sunday) at approximately 1335 hrs Deputies responded to 1050 Robert Smalls Parkway, Beaufort SC 29906 (Broad River Boat Landing) in reference to assisting Department of Natural Resources (DNR), in reference to possible human remains found near the landing.

## Details of Supplemental Narrative:

Upon arrival at the Broad River Boat Landing, I began speaking to DNR officer Pope who advised that he was speaking to officers that were in contact with the human body, approximately 1/4 mile from the landing. Sgt Guise began delegation of duties, and I was assigned to assisting with retrieval of the remains. Myself and Sgt Guise were provided a boat ride by DNR officer Carter to the location of the deceased. I observed the deceased to be laying face down, wearing brown shoes, muddy blue jeans, a dark in color muddy jacket, with blonde hair. I observed her left arm to be bent and under her.

Sgt Guise remained with the deceased with DNR officers, and I returned with Officer Carter to the boat landing. Deputy Corner Ott and Investigator Abell then boarded the boat. Upon returning to the location, I began taking digital images of the area with Inv. Abell's digital camera, including the direction we were traveling, as the creek's branch out in different directions. Upon arrival at the deceased location, I took digital images of the body. I then assisted DNR with placing the body in a yellow body bag, supplied by Deputy Corner Ott: Investigator Abell assumed the photo documentation as I assisted, and will be submitting all taken photos for evidence. I then boarded the boat, with DNR officer Lt. Michael Thomas, DNR Officer Baxter, and the body bag, and arrived back at the landing.

Case Information:

On 03/03/2019 at 1335 hours, BCSO responded to the Broad River Boat landing, Beaufort, Beaufort County, SC 29906 in reference to a missing boater (Port Royal Case # 19PR04467 and SCDNR Case # 19-02-0944). Subsequently the recovery of the missing boater was conducted.

Investigation:

On 03/03/2019 at 1406 hours I was contacted by SSgt Draisen in reference to the missing boater (Mallory Beach) possibly being located in the vicinity of the Broad River Boat Landing. SSgt Draisen request I respond to the incident location. MSgt Fraser was contact while I was responding to the boat landing and briefed on the incident. Upon arriving at the incident location I was briefed by Cpl Kline on advised of the boaters that made the discovery. Refer to Cpl Kline's supplemental report for interviews and written statements.

After being briefed I was contacted by Sgt Guise whom was on a DNR boat at the incident location. He advised another DNR boat was coming to the boat landing to get Coroner Otts and myself. I then met with Coroner Otts and discussed the recovery operation. Coroner Otts and I were then transported to the recovery location (32°20'.159N / 080°45'.608W).

Note: According to Google Maps the entrance to the creek is approximately 1754 feet north of the boat landing and the recovery location is approximately 4107 feet (straight line) NNE from the boat landing.

While in transit to the recovery location and with the use of my camera LCpl Bryd took approach photographs. While at the recovery location my camera was again was used by LCpl Byrd to take recovery photographs due to him standing on land. The remaining photographs were taken by me from the SCDNR boat. A female body was recovered and transported back to the Broad River Boat Landing by SCDNR and Coroner Otts took possession of the body and then had her transported to his facility.

Once back at the boat landing I spoke with SCDNR Investigator Michael Brock. He advised based on the physical and clothing description that the female recovered was Mallory Beach. I informed Brock that a copy of the photographs would be available for him through BCSO Evidence. Port Royal Officer Reynard whom is the original case officer was on scene and made aware of the recovery.

The family notification will be conducted by Coroner Otts and SCDNR.

### Synopsis:

On 02-24-19, the BCSO was asked to assist in an investigation being handled by the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR), which yielded potential evidence in their investigation.

### Officer's Observations and Actions:

On 03-03-19 (1334), BCSO responded to 1000 Robert Smalls Parkway (Broad River Boat Landing), Burton, SC in reference to BCSO Dipatch receiving a report of a civilian possibly locating a deceased female in the marsh. The civilian stated they were in a creek, just off the shoreline near Skoski Court, Burton, SC.

At 1349, I made contact with Kenneth Campbell via telephone, 843-422-6209, where he informed me that he was in a creek just off the Broad River and not too far from the Broad River Boat Landings. He informed that he and his brother were just trying to help in locating the missing boater, Mallory Beach.

At this time, I was standing on a tidal creek pier at 6815 Oakmont Dr. (Oakmont Subdivision). From this location and could see a male standing on top of a hard top style roof of a boat. He was waving his arms. I was informed by the caller that it was his brother that was with him and waving. I could see a DNR boat making their way to that location, from the Broad River and getting in contact with them. Kenneth informed me that he was hanging up the phone because DNR pulled up to him. Once I observed this, I made my way back to the Broad River Boat Landing.

At 1400, arrived on scene and made contact with DNR Officer Pope who advised that DNR Officers Thomas and Baxter were in contact with a deceased female in the marsh line of a creek, West of the Broad River Boat Landing. They believed it to be the missing boater, Malory Beach.

At 1405 two boaters arrived at the boat landing, Kenneth Campbell and Keith Campbell, who advised they left DNR with the body and returned to the landing. They were directed to speak with Cpl Kline and provide written statement. (See Cpl Kline's Supplemental Report).

At 1415, LCpl Byrd and I boarded a DNR boat with DNR Officer Dupree and made our way to the location of the body. This location was approximately 1/4 mile West of the Broad River Boat Landing. Upon arrival, at the location of the body, it was documented by LCpl Abell that coordinates were 32.30.159N and 080.45.608W via DNR's boat GPS.

At 1422, LCpl Byrd and I arrived on scene with DNR Officer Thomas and DNR Officer Baxter who were on a small WarEagle boat. The boat was pulled up next to the bank of the north side of the creek. There was a female body that was clothed and laying face down on the bank in the marsh line. A short time, I stayed with DNR Officers Thomas and Baxter as LCpl Bryd and DNR Officer Dupree returned to the landing to make contact with BCSO Investigator Abell, DNR Investigator Officer Brock, and Deputy Coroner Ott to bring them to our location.

At 1435, LCpl Byrd, LCpl Abell, DNR Officer Investigator Brock, Deputy Coroner Ott, and DNR Dupree arrived. BCSO Investigator Abell assisted in the investigation, took photographs of the scene, and assisted Deputy Coroner Ott. The deceased female was loaded onto the DNR's WarEagle boat.

At 1449, LCpl Abell, DNR Officer Brock, Deputy Coroner Ott, DNR Dupree and I returned in DNR Officer Dupree's boat. DNR Officer Thomas, Baxter, and

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LCpl Byrd made their way back to the Broad River Boat Landing with the deceased.

At 1455, LCpl Abell, DNR Officer Brock, Deputy Coroner Ott, DNR Dupree and I arrived at the Broad River Boat Landing in DNR Officer Dupree's boat.

At 1458, DNR Officer Thomas, Baxter, and LCpl Byrd arrived at the Broad River Boat Landing with the deceased's body.

SSgt Draisen was informed of our findings and this supplemental report was completed.

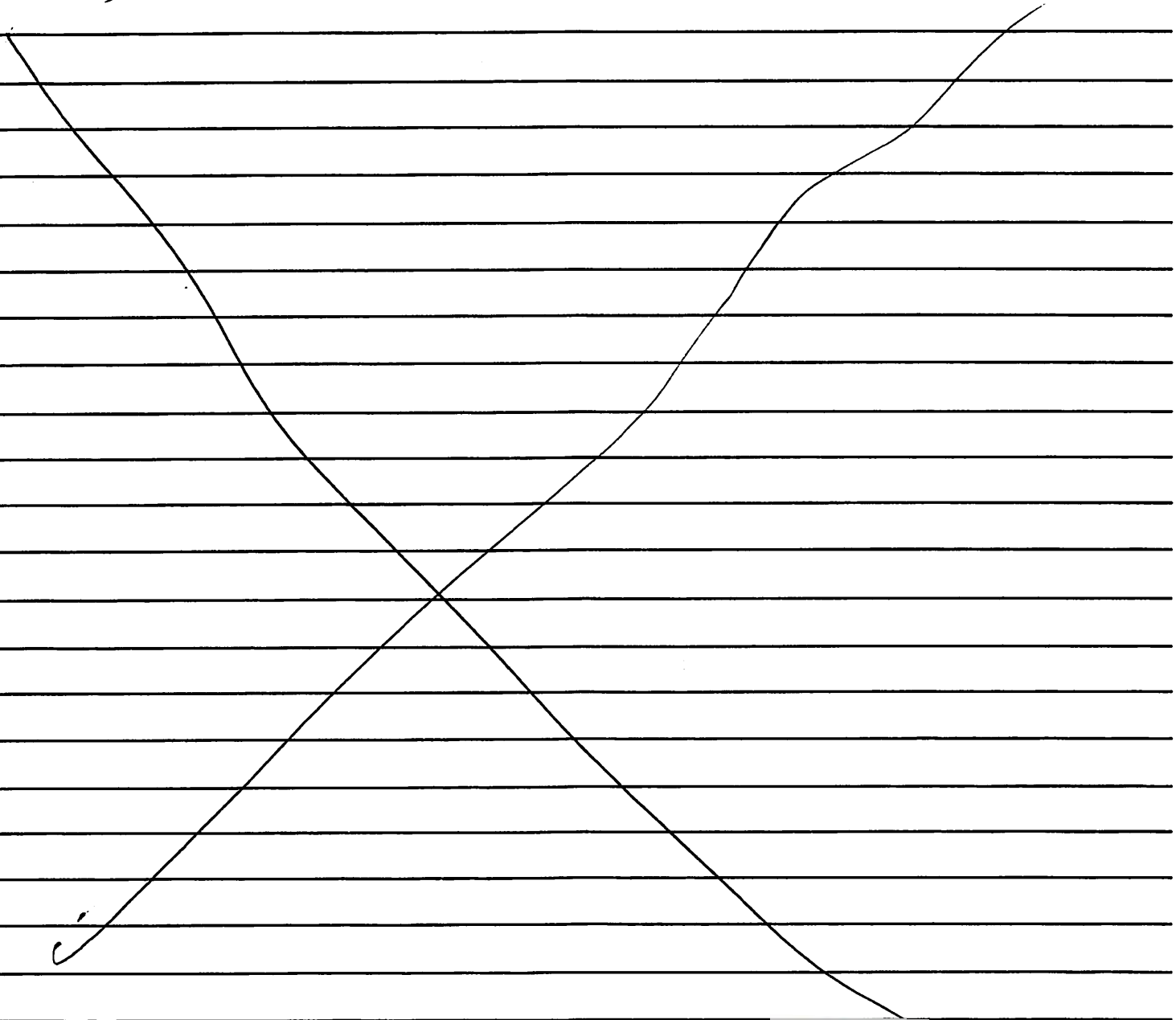
