

I am writing this letter with a saddened heart and a deep concern for two people whom I have known and deeply loved for 26 years, Dr. Wayne and Susan Miller. Several months ago I called the residence of the Millers and spoke to Mrs. Miller. She asked me if I had heard the news and I responded that I had not. At that point she proceeded to tell me of the impending divorce between she and Dr. Miller.

As a personal friend and also a Pastor I was immediately concerned and began to ask her what had happened. At that point she proceeded to inform me that she had committed adultery and that she had absolutely no remorse nor was her conscience violated. She also indicated that because of her sacrifice for the years she was married to Dr. Miller, she was going to demand what she considered a just recompense. I have not seen any evidence of Mrs. Miller having a change of heart, nor has she displayed sensitivity to the children and to the members of the congregation over which Dr. Miller is Pastor. She has continued to spread slanderous rumor and has threatened the children that she would ruin their Daddy's reputation and their school.

Having experienced growing up in a broken home, I know too personally the pain and scarring that is inevitably forced upon the children. Children whose parents are breaking their marriage commitment need to be kept in an environment that is familiar and consistent. My brothers, sister and I were removed from our schools, our friends, and our home. We felt tainted and were embarrassed to tell people the reason we had come to a new school was because of our parents divorce.

The Miller's children have been in a good environment that teaches not only Christian values, but also has an excellent academic reputation. They have friends and family there that care about them and are willing to comfort them and help to isolate them from the pain and embarrassment which they will experience.

Due to the circumstances in this situation, I strongly recommend that Dr. Miller be allowed to have custody of his children so that he may keep their environment as familiar as possible, and so that he may continue to ensure the moral and academic excellence of their lives.

Defendant answers and counterclaims to the complaint of the Plaintiff as follows:

FOR A FIRST DEFENSE

- 1. Each and every allegation not specifically admitted, qualified, or explained is hereby denied and strict proof is demanded thereof.
 - 2. Admits Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3.
 - 3. Denies Paragraph 4.
- 4. Denies Paragraph 5 and affirmatively alleges that he has been the primary caretaker of the minor children.
- 5. Denies Paragraph 6 on the grounds that Defendant is informed and believes that he should be granted custody of the minor children, *pendente lite* and permanently.
- 6. Denies Paragraph 7 and affirmatively alleges that it is in the parties' best interests that Plaintiff immediately vacate the former marital residence to allow it to be rented or sold to avoid foreclosure.
- 7. Denies Paragraph 8 and affirmatively alleges that the vehicle currently in Plaintiff's possession is not a marital asset and therefore that issue is not properly before this court.
 - 8. Denies Paragraph 9.
 - 9. Denies so much of Paragraph 10 as alleges that Plaintiff assisted in

the accumulation of assets and affirmatively alleges that all Plaintiff assisted in was the accumulation of debt; however, Defendant has no objection to the relief requested in Paragraph 10 as long as such relief is mutual

- 10. Denies Paragraphs 11 and 12.
- 11. Has no objection to the relief requested in Paragraphs 13 and 14 as long as such relief is mutual and that it does not interfere with the sale of the marital home to prevent foreclosure.
- 12. Denies that there is any basis for Plaintiff requesting a restraining order; however, Defendant has no objection to such relief as long as such relief is mutual.

FOR A SECOND DEFENSE

- 13. Defendant re-alleges each and every allegation of the first defense as if sully set out herein verbatim.
- 14. Upon information and belief Plaintiff has engaged in a pattern of adulterous conduct and therefore is barred from receiving alimony pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 20-3-130 (A) (Law Co-op. 1976).

FOR A THIRD DEFENSE AND BY WAY OF COUNTERCLAIM

- 15. Each and every allegation of the first and second defense are realleged as if fully set out herein verbatim.
- 16. Defendant is a citizen and resident of Horry County, South Carolina and has been for more than one year prior to the commencement of this action.
- 17. Upon information and belief, Plaintiff is a resident of Horry County, South Carolina.
- 18. The parties were married on April 14, 1974. Due to Plaintiff's adulterous affairs with other men, the parties separated on February 25, 2001 and have lived separate and apart since that time. Defendant is informed and believes that he is entitled to a divorce a *vinculo matrimonii* based upon the statutory grounds of adultery and asks that this Court grant him the same.
- 19. Three children were born of this marriage: John Paul Miller, date of birth May 20, 1979; Patrick Ryan Miller, date of birth December 7, 1983 and Lacy

Noelle Miller, date of birth December 27, 1990. John Paul Miller is emancipated.

- 20. Defendant has always been the primary caregiver of the minor child despite the fact that Plaintiff did not work outside the home. Defendant has a warm and nurturing relationship with the minor children. He is informed and believes that it is in the best interests of the minor children that he be granted custody, *pendente lite* and permanently, and asks that this Court grant him the same.
- 21. Upon information and belief Plaintiff is an able-bodied woman and earning sufficient income to pay a reasonable amount of child support. Defendant is informed and believes that he is entitled to child support according to the South Carolina Child Support Guidelines, *pendente lite* and permanently, and asks that this Court award him the same.
- 22. Throughout the marriage the parties have acquired minimal marital property and substantial marital debts. Despite Defendant's pleas to Plaintiff to live within their resources, Defendant has squandered their income and assets. Defendant is informed and believes that he is entitled to an equitable division of the marital property and debts and asks that this Court grant him the same.
- 23. Defendant has repeatedly asked the Plaintiff to vacate the former marital residence to allow the parties to put it up for sale. Plaintiff refuses to leave and refuses to take care of the property. Instead she continues to allow its market value to diminish and is putting the property at risk of foreclosure. He is informed and believes that he is entitled to an order requiring the Plaintiff to vacate the former marital residence so that the house can be rented or put up for sale to avoid foreclosure and asks that this Court grant him the same.
- 24. Plaintiff has a history of threatening Defendant especially at his place of employment causing him to not only fear for his safety but also for his job. Defendant is informed and believes that he is entitled to a restraining order, pendente lite and permanently, and asks that this Court grant him the same.
- 25. Defendant is informed and believes that the Plaintiff should be restrained from incurring any more debt in his name or for which he might be held

responsible, pendente lite and permanently, and asks that this Court issue a restraining order enjoining the Plaintiff from such conduct.

- 26. Defendant is in need of discovery to adequately prepare his case for trial. Defendant asks that this Court grant him discovery pursuant to the <u>South Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure</u> and the <u>South Carolina Rules of Family Court.</u>
- 27. Due to the wrongful conduct of the Plaintiff, Defendant has been forced to retain an attorney to protect himself and the minor children. Defendant is without funds to pay his attorney and is need of attorney's fees from the Plaintiff.
