

TEMPORARY ORDER (Not Ending Action)

This matter is before the court upon the parties' cross Motions for Temporary Relief seeking a <u>pendente lite</u> order for custody, child support, alimony, use and possession of marital residence, use and possession of a vehicle, discovery, restraining order, and attorney fees and costs. The Defendant was properly served and duly served his Answer, Counterclaim and Motion for Temporary Relief, dated and filed on May 21, 2001. Both parties and their counsel were present. Both counsel filed their respective client's affidavits and Financial Declaration. After the hearing heard the initial hearing on June 26, 2001 the Court forwarded a letter of instructions to Plaintiff's counseling requesting the preparation of the Temporary Order. Subsequent to the issuance of the letter of instructions, certain matters occurred requiring the Plaintiff's Counsel to make a Motion for

clarification which was heard by this Court on July 27, 2001.

FINDINGS OF SALIENT FACT

Based upon the pleadings, the affidavits, and the financial declarations, I find the following salient facts:

- The Plaintiff and Defendant are citizens and residents of Horry County, South Carolina, and have been for a period in excess of one year prior to the commencement of this action.
 Both parties are subject to the jurisdiction of this Court.
- The Plaintiff and Defendant are husband and wife, having been married on April 14, 1974 Three children have been born of this marriage namely John-Paul Miller, whose date of birth is May 20, 1979; Patrick Ryan Miller, whose date of birth is December 7, 1983; and Lacy Noelle Miller, whose date of birth is December 27, 1990.
- 3. The parties last resided together in Horry County, South Carolina, and have lived separate and apart since on or about February 25, 2001.
- 4. The Court finds that the Plaintiff shall have temporary custody of the parties' two minor children, Patrick Ryan Miller and Lacy Noelle Miller.
- 5. The Court further finds that the Defendant shall have visitation with Lacy Noelle Miller from 5:00 p.m. on Friday until 5:00 p.m. on Sunday every other week commencing Friday, July 6, 2001 and continuing until further order of this Court. The Defendant may have additional visitation as agreed between the parties. For purposes of visitation, the Defendant shall pick up and return his daughter from the Plaintiff's residence. The Court finds that due to the age of the parties' son, Patrick Ryan Miller, the Defendant's visitation with Patrick shall be as the Defendant and his son can agree.
- 6. The Court finds that the Defendant shall pay temporary child support pursuant to the South Carolina Department of Social Services Child Support Guidelines in the monthly amount of Six Hundred Twenty-nine (\$629.00) Dollars based upon the Plaintiff's gross monthly income of One Thousand One Hundred Fifty-three (\$1,153.00) Dollars and the Defendant's gross monthly income of Four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-three (\$4,333.00) Dollars. The Defendant pays health insurance coverage on the children in the amount of \$107.30. The child support payments shall be payable through the office of the Clerk of Court plus

- three (3%) percent court costs of Eighteen and 87/100 (\$18.87) Dollars for a total monthly payment of Six Hundred forty-seven and 87/100 (\$647.87) Dollars, commencing July 1, 2001 and continuing on the first day of each month. See attached Worksheet A.
- Passed upon the Motion for clarification and based upon the fact that the Plaintiff and the minor children have vacated the marital residence and have leased an apartment, the Court finds that the Defendant shall pay unto the Plaintiff the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty (\$750.00) Dollars per month temporary alimony commencing August 10, 2001 and continuing on the tenth day of each month thereafter until further order of this Court. The alimony shall be payable through the Office of the Clerk of Court plus three (3%) percent court costs of Twenty-two and 50/100 (\$22.50) Dollars for a total monthly payment of Seven Hundred Seventy-two and 50/100 (\$772.50) Dollars.
- 8. The Court finds that the former marital residence of the parties located at 1850 Southwood Drive, Surfside Beach, South Carolina maybe sold by the Defendant in an effort to avoid mortgage foreclosure. The Court finds that any net proceeds derived from the sale of the marital home shall be held in an interest being account with any disbursements being made pursuant to an order of this Court.
- 9. The Court further finds that each party shall retain the use and possession of the vehicle in their physical possession and specifically that the Plaintiff is entitled to use and possession of a Taurus automobile. The Defendant is to be responsible for maintaining the insurance on Plaintiff's vehicle. The Plaintiff is to be responsible for maintenance and upkeep on subject vehicle.
- 10. I find that both parties are to maintain any insurance policies that were in existence at the time of the filing of this action with no change in coverage and/or beneficiary thereon. Each party shall be responsible for any noncovered or deductible medical expenses for the minor children on a proportional based upon the South Carolina Department of Social Services Child Support Worksheet A.
- 11. The Court finds that the parties are mutually restrained and enjoined from abusing, threatening to abuse or molesting the other in any manner whatsoever.
- 12. The Court finds that the parties are mutually restrained and enjoined from selling, transferring, encumbering or otherwise dissipating any of the marital assets including, but



not limited to, insurance policies, retirement accounts, IRA's and the like.

- 13. The Court further finds that the parties are mutually restrained and enjoined from incurring any additional marital indebtedness without the consent of both parties.
- 14. The Court finds that the parties may engage in mutual discovery in accordance with the applicable rules of the <u>South Carolina Rules of civil Procedure.</u>
- 15. The Court finds this is an appropriate case for attorney fees. The Defendant shall pay temporary attorney fees of Twenty-five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars within forty-five (45) days from the date of this order. The allocation of the attorney fees is reserved for determination at the merits hearing. Payment shall be made by the Defendant directly to Plaintiff's attorney, David R. Gravely, Post Office Box 357, Myrtle Beach, South Carolina 29578.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Court concludes as a matter of law that it has jurisdiction to hear and determine all issues in this action and of the parties.

This Temporary Order has no precedential value. It is, therefore,

PERSONALLY appeared before me, Wayne Miller, who first being duly sworn deposes and says that:

- 1. On June 26, 2001 at the first temporary hearing in this case, the Court ordered me to pay child support by the Guidelines and \$1,000 per month to Susan as partial reimbursement for the mortgage payment on the former marital home where she was living. The Court took the matter under advisement and the following day wrote a letter to the attorneys with a ruling. Before that order was written, Susan moved out of the house and insisted that the \$1,000 was really alimony. She had not paid anything on the mortgage. She filed a motion dated July 20, 2001 asking for clarification of the Court's ruling and that motion was heard on July 27, 2001. The Court requested additional information. On August 7, 2001 the Court issued a written order requiring me to pay Susan \$750 per month in alimony and \$629 per month in child support.
- 2. At the time of the previous hearings my gross income \$4,333 per month. Since then my salary has been cut 35% to \$2817 per month. I am the pastor at Cathedral Baptist Church. The receipts at the church have decreased drastically this year as is evidenced by the financial statement attached. This reduction in receipts has forced the Board of Trustees to reduce salaries of *all* staff, not just mine. A copy of the resolution by the board of trustees to conduct a salary study is attached. As a result of the salary study our staff member salaries were reduced effective August 1, 2001.

- 3. Another consequence of the decrease in giving is that the church has canceled my health insurance; therefore, I do not have any medical insurance on myself nor can I get it for the children. I have asked Susan to add the children to her policy at work and let me pay her for the coverage, but she has refused. She says that is my responsibility.
- 4. The financial obligations have been overwhelming. After paying the children's medical insurance (\$107), child support (\$647.87), and alimony (\$772.50), I have \$23.91 per month left. I was forced to file for bankruptcy (Chapter 7) on September 26, 2001. The first creditor's meeting is on November 2, 2001. At present I am still obligated for all of these debts until the trustee makes a recommendation and the Bankruptcy Court issues an order deciding if or how I will pay creditors.
- 5. The Court had ordered me to get health insurance on the Plaintiff; I do not even have health insurance on myself. My employer had to cancel it because of the decrease in receipts. Susan, on the other hand, does have medical insurance available through her employer. I ask that the Court relieve me of this obligation simply because it is not available to me.
- 6. Although I much prefer to have custody of my children, if Susan is going to have custody on a temporary basis, then I have no objection to paying child support. I continue to feed them breakfast, lunch, and sometimes supper. I bought their school clothes because Susan refused to do so. I pay \$200 per month in after school care for Lacy so that Susan and I both can work. I will make sure that my children's needs are met. I ask the Court to reduce my child support according to the Guidelines.
- 7. Susan's adultery is a hotly contested issue. I am confident that I can prove it at a final hearing when Susan and her witnesses are subject to cross-examination; however, the chances for me ever recovering any alimony that the Court orders me to pay on a temporary basis is slim. I simply do not have the money to pay alimony. The children's needs must be met first. I ask that the Court eliminate the alimony award to stop the bleeding.

The trustees of Cathedral Baptist Church have unanimously voted to drastically reduce the salaries of the staff of Cathedral Baptist Church due to a \$22,000 drop in giving in January through June of this year compared with January through June of last year. Three of the four have signed a resolution: Rev. Paul Jackson, Rev. Charles Randall, and Rev. Carl Wiggins. However, Rev. Isaiah Johnson left for a mission trip for two weeks. He will not be back until the middle of August to put his signature on the resolution. Only then can a copy with all signatures — be put in the Minute Book and provided to whoever needs to see it. The salaries to be lowered are as follows: Senior Pastor, R.W. Miller

\$1,000 to \$650 per week (a \$350 reduction)

Minister of Music: a \$100 in weekly salary

Business Manager: a \$350 or more reduction

Bookkeeper: A \$150 or more reduction

These cuts take effect for the months of August-December.

- 4. A study of all salaries should be made to compare what cuts may be necessary to make up the loss thus far this year and to insure that the budget will not be in the red by December. Recommendations for salary cuts will be made at the meeting at the end of July or first of August. There being no other business the meeting is adjourned.
