PERSONALLY appeared before me, R. Wayne Miller, who first being duly sworn, deposes and says that:

- 1. With regard to the matter of the \$1,000 payment I again ask that the Court remember that Susan has committed adultery and as a result is not entitled to alimony. She practically admitted the same in paragraph 26 of her affidavit previously submitted to the Court. It was my understanding that this sum was to partially reimburse Susan for the mortgage payment. She has made no payments since the temporary hearing as ordered.
- 2. Susan did move out of the house. When I went in to clean it up, it was worse than I thought. There is a major leak in the roof which will cost approximately \$2,000 to repair. There is also at least \$2,000 in repair work that must be done on the inside to get it ready to sell. These figures do not include the cost of painting.
- 3. Several weeks before the temporary hearing my employer had to cancel Susan's medical insurance as a cost cutting measure. I still thought the children would be covered. After the temporary hearing, my office called to find out what the cost of medical insurance on the children alone was so that it could be calculated into the Child Support Guidelines. It was then that I learned that because Susan was the primary insured, the company would not cover the children. Patrick needs to have a tonsillectomy soon, and now no insurance company that I have found will cover him for that. Unfortunately, there is no

medical insurance to maintain the status quo; I wish there were. It was gone by the time of the temporary hearing even though I did not know it at the time.

- 3. I think Susan can be covered under a group policy at work. I ask that the Court order that she obtain that insurance for Patrick and Lacy and then calculate it into my child support obligation.
- 4. Cathedral Baptist Church, the church I work, for owns the car that Susan drives. It is titled in the church's name. The payment of \$292.28 is due on the 25th of each month and the insurance is \$103 per month. A statement to that effect from the business administrator of Cathedral Baptist Church is attached.

PERSONALLY appeared before me, Susan Miller, who, being duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

- I am the Plaintiff in the above action in which I seek an order of separate support and maintenance, custody, child support, alimony, equitable distribution, attorney fees and costs, and other related matrimonial relief. My husband, Reginal Wayne Miller, and I met when I was in high school in 1971 when I visited his church, Evergreen United Methodist, and heard him speak. I later began attending a community prayer meeting where I was asked to speak. Wayne was also there, and I began noticing how handsome he was, and he inquired about me. I graduated from high school and went to Winthrop College. During my second year there, Wayne called my mother, asked for my phone number, and asked me out for a date.
- Wayne and I started dating and during my third year at Winthrop, he asked me to marry him. I wanted to finish college but decided I loved him more. He showed his temper at my parents' house, pointed his finger in their face, and slammed the door so hard we thought it would break off the hinges. My parents didn't want me to

marry him, but Wayne told me I had to choose between "them" or "him". I was hurt, but Wayne wanted us to marry, so against my parents' wishes, I quit college and married Wayne on April 14, 1974. My parents were disappointed that I quit school and more disappointed that I married Wayne. They were so upset about the marriage that they would not attend my wedding ceremony.

- 3. I had a job as a clerk typist at a Dixie Cup Plant and worked everyday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Wayne would sleep late and would go to his little church which he started himself with only a small group of people. He was "discharged" from the United Methodist Church in Evergreen, South Carolina. I Never knew why they let him go. There were rumors, but I was too much in love to ever believe there was any truth to them.
- After six months of working, Wayne wanted me to quit so I could spend more time 4. with him, stay at home, and be more help to him as a pastor's wife in building his ministry. To please Wayne and help our ministry, I quit my job. I started having church members over for dinner so we could get to know them and help them feel a part of our church. We often had church meetings, prayer groups, and bible studies in our home. Every week we would have some family over for dinner. The various church functions consumed our lives. We had little time for each other. As a new wife, I wanted time alone with my husband, but he did not seem to want or even care if we were intimate. He would even take one of his friends, either a young Bible School student or a young man, with us when we would finally have time together. Wayne insisted that I ride in the back of the car behind him, while he and his friend rode in the front seat. I began feeling like an "outsider" in my own marriage. I was so in love with Wayne, but I never felt he loved me as I did him. Wayne even started going out at night with his "friend", whoever it was at the time, leaving me home alone. I wondered why I quit working, just to be his "servant".
- 5. I continued doing whatever Wayne asked of me. I started doing the church

"newsletter" in our home, and once a week several members of our church came to our home to prepare the church mailing. I even started keeping the nursery at the church to try and be a "good pastor's wife" and make Wayne proud he married me. Wayne started a Bible College in Florence, South Carolina and needed me to teach typing and shorthand. Doing all I possibly knew to please Wayne and make him proud of me, I began taking piano lessons to become Wayne's image of what a pastor's wife should be. Wayne insisted that I wear dresses to church and wanted me to look the part of a pastor's wife, so he bought me pretty clothes. I played the piano for church service once. I did my best to assist Wayne in his ministry.

- 6. Wayne always wanted to be "well known" as a pastor and speaker, so be began traveling to other places, speaking to sharing groups or small churches. He preferred taking a male friend or bible school student than me. I began feeling very lonely and unloved. Sometimes I would cry and ask if he still loved me. He would say "yes" but he never spent much time with me and never seemed to want or need sex. I knew something was just not right. Wayne told me I was "too fat" and I was not a "turn on". He told me hurtful things like, "if I was woman enough" I could get him aroused enough for him to have sex with me. I was humiliated. I tried everything, but to no avail. We began having more problems sexually. Our sexual problems were always my fault.
- 7. Before our marriage, I was involved in a national Christian organization that met weekly. After my marriage, I attended a weekly prayer group for women which I believed would help build our ministry. Wayne took various groups of people to visit the Holy Land. Once he allowed me to accompany him, but I realized again that it was not a time for "us" but for him to teach and show people the Holy Land.
- 8. We continued to work very hard at the ministry. It was literally a twenty-four hour every day process. Even in the middle of the night, he was often interrupted to go visit church members who were in distress or sick. Our entire life seemed to be

always working for the parishioners. Having a member over once a week wasn't enough for Wayne. It was all the time — Monday mornings were shared with other peopled in preparing and mailing out the church "newsletter"; Tuesdays were taken up with prayer groups and teaching at the bible college; and Thursdays were taken up with teaching and evening church service. Fridays seemed to be our only opportunity to be alone, but Wayne never seemed to want to be alone with me. He preferred being with everyone else; he said they needed him. I told him that I was his wife and had needs too, but he never wanted to touch me. We would go months without being together intimately. He was too busy to care about me as he was always doing things with his male friends. He would continue to tell me I was too fat or I turned him off, but he seemed to get aroused with his male friends, whomever he was with at the time. Wayne began taking trips without me but with male friends who often were usually a young bible school student.

- 9. We had worked so hard building the church that at one time we had the largest charismatic church in Eastern South Carolina. We even began a television ministry called "Good Morning Jesus" that was televised five (5) mornings each week. We also did radio talk shows.
- 10. On May 20, 1979 we had our first child, John-Paul. Wayne continued inviting himself to prayer groups. He wanted to become "well known" so badly. He loved being in the public eye and thrived on people admiring him. Our second child, Patrick, was born on December 17, 1983. Wayne would continually leave the children and me to travel all over the United States to start television programs for "Good Morning Jesus." He took the children and me to New England, but be went along with his associate most of the time. Our sons hardly knew who their father was as he was too busy for them and me. When he was home, he was too tired to even play with our children. I always took care of all of our children's needs since Wayne was always busy either studying, planning, sleeping, or gone. I became involved with

a group of breast feeding women called "LaLeche League". I had monthly meetings, sometimes in my home. My whole life was being a father and mother to my children. They were my complete joy and happiness. They loved and needed me as much as I did them. My children went with me everywhere unless I accompanied Wayne to a function, at which time the children would stay with my mother. When one of the children would wake during the night, Wayne would ask me to go to another bedroom with the child to keep from disturbing him. I eventually began sleeping separately because he never had a desire for sex, and I grew tired of his putting me down. It was difficult with two babies under five, and we would sometimes get into arguments. Once or twice, our arguments resulted in Wayne hitting me. My children were my whole life. My husband didn't need or want me except to wait on him and be his servant. He would lay on the couch and want me to wait on him.

- 11. Wayne would not allow our children to miss church at all not even if they were sick. He did not allowed our children to observe Halloween, Santa Claus, or the Easter Bunny. Although I disagreed with this, I respected his wishes because he was "head of our household", and I was afraid of him. A few times, Wayne called me in front of the church people and said embarrassing and humiliating things to me. Since I had not finished college and little work experience, I had no real good job skills. Therefore, I endured Wayne's behavior.
- 12. Wayne provide me with a charge card for Belk and J.C. Penney to use for the purchase of clothes although most of my clothes were bought at the Hartsville Manufacturing Company. My mother bought ninety (90%) percent of our children's clothes. Wayne had major credit cards, i.e. Discover, Visa MasterCard and American Express, and when he had used the available credit line on one of the cards, he would obtain one in my name. Wayne made me sign some papers once which I later learned was a second mortgage on our home. Wayne has always felt he was smarter than I. Once he threatened to take away my car keys if I didn't do as he said. I

- eventually did whatever he asked because I didn't want my children to suffer any more than necessary.
- World. Wayne lost his temper and beat John-Paul with a leather belt so badly there were bloody stripes covering both of John-Paul's legs. I was shocked! It was horrible. Wayne made me go out of the room and would not let me in. On another occasion at home, Wayne beat John-Paul horribly. This time I intervened but marks were already on John-Paul. Wayne said the Bible said to spare the rod, spoil the child." No matter what John-Paul did, the punishment was always more severe than the crime. The next day my mother saw John-Paul and told us that she would call Social Services if she ever say his buttocks, back, and legs blue, cut and bruised again.
- 14. My role as a wife was to "help meet" my husband's needs, do whatever he told me to do, even if it meant letting the children wait for whatever they wanted or taking the children to church even if they were sick. I was to "submit" to him because he was head of our household. That is what Wayne said the Bible says. Many times my children needed school clothes or church clothes, and Wayne would say he didn't have the money. However, when it came time for him to take trips to speak or to go on vacation to Bermuda, he would find a way to buy for himself, even it meant charging them. He then would tell people I was responsible for all of the charges. He has a charge card in the name of Cathedral Baptist Church which he used for personal things such as trips to Charleston, cruises to Bermuda, gas, dinners with friends, and flowers for one of his male friend employee's yard.
- 15. When we lived in Florence, South Carolina, we had a beautiful two story home with a Florida room, a living room, a formal diving room, a playroom, four bedrooms, a library, den, and a lovely manicured yard surrounded by a brick fence. One night around two or three in the morning, I woke up and Wayne was not anywhere. I

learned the next morning that Wayne was in one of the bedrooms in our home with Alon Cook, a handsome young minister who had attended our Bible College two years earlier. I was so shocked! Shortly thereafter, I had two wives of Bible School students in their thirties tell me that my husband had tried to feel their genitals and wrestle with them or get on top of them while they were on speaking engagements. I think I was in total shock, and my world began slowly crumbling. I was devastated and wondered just what kind of a person had I married.

- 16. A few months later, I kept hearing more rumors or sexual innuendoes. When WPDE, Channel 15 out of Florence heard about Wayne's inappropriate activities, it aired a segment about Wayne for five nights in November or December of 1988 or 1989. Several men were on the program with their faces blurred and their voices disguised to protect their identify. They told how Wayne tried making sexual advances toward them. The Florence Morning Newspaper even had an article about Wayne and "alleged homosexuality." I became fearful for my children and for me. I wondered if I could possibly get AIDS from Wayne.
- 17. The families in our neighborhood began talking about us, and the things they said embarrassed my children so much. My sons lost their friends and became lonely as no mothers would even let their children come to my house again. We tried everything to build a ministry again, but we eventually had to move out of Florence. No one would forget the television report aired by WPDE. We were forced to sell our beautiful home and leave our friends and my parents. I could have left Wayne then, but I hated to leave him when he was down and needed help. I agreed to stay and help him. So we packed up and moved to Myrtle Beach. I helped him start a brand new ministry called "Cathedral". We covered his mistakes up in Florence, hoping no one would ever find out. Wayne told me that if I would stay he would go for counseling. We both did for several years, and our marriage improved somewhat. We had a third child, Lacy, on December 27, 1990.

- Our children were and are the most wonderful part of our marriage. They are my entire life. Wayne allowed me to stay at home with them and not work outside the home for almost 27 years. All I have ever done well is be a mother. It means everything to me. He never wanted me to work and leave them. When our daughter, Lacy, began school, I decided to go back to college and take one subject at a time. This was wonderful for my self esteem. Wayne paid for two or three semesters then decided he would not pay for any more classes. I continued my education with my sister's assistance. I kept taking one or two classes each semester. I maintained a 4.0 GPA and was one of sixteen students out of 150 to be accepted into the dental hygiene program.
- 19. When our home in Florence sold, we got approximately \$43,000.00 in net proceeds. Instead of Wayne getting a regular job to support our family, Wayne held church services in a store hoping the crowd would develop overnight to support us. We lived off the proceeds from the sale of our home and used some of the proceeds to pay off our credit card debt. When we moved to Myrtle Beach, Lacy was about two years old, and I did not want to put her in daycare. Patrick attended Lakewood Elementary school, and John-Paul attended Socastee High School. It seemed much easier for Wayne to work than for me to leave our three (3) children. He was very capable of working. He had made a living teaching piano at one time. I encouraged Wayne to study and take the real estate exam, hoping he could sell real estate at least part time to help us out financially. He did well on the test and sold real estate for a short time. His heart was set on his ministry, so he quit selling real estate.
- 20. Eventually, Wayne started a Bible College in Myrtle Beach. Our church property in Florence sold, and after the mortgage was paid, we had enough money to purchase the Chapel at the former Myrtle Beach Air Force Base. Wayne and two fifteen-year associates taught at the Bible College. Wayne received an honorary doctorate degree from Indiana Bible University, and ever since that time has requested that he
