On February 28, 2023, at approximately 9:16 p.m., Special Agent (S/A) Wayne Kirby of the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division conducted an audio/video recorded interview with [REDACTED] at his residence, located at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was interviewed regarding allegations that a member of the jury in the murder trial of Richard Alexander "Alex" Murdaugh had given [REDACTED] information about her opinions regarding the trial. Agent's Note: The interview summarized in this memorandum is not intended to be a verbatim account and does not memorialize all statements made during the interview. Please refer to the video for reference. [REDACTED] provided the following information: S/A Kirby told

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[REDACTED] that there was an allegation that someone spoke with him about the Murdaugh Murder trial. [REDACTED] replied with, "No, not really." He was explained the importance of being honest about the incident. He thought for a short time and said, "One of the jurors was at our house." Dandridge was asked who the juror was, and he said, "Myra Crosby." S/A Kirby asked [REDACTED] how he knew that Myra Crosby was a member of the jury and he said, "She (Myra Crosby) told us she was a juror." He explained that on or around February 18, 2023, at approximately 9:00 a.m., while at his residence [REDACTED], his landlord, Myra Crosby and her husband, John "Timmy" Crosby delivered a replacement refrigerator. Also, in the residence was [REDACTED]'s fiancé, [REDACTED]. While inside the residence, Myra Crosby asked [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] if they had been keeping up with the Murdaugh Murder trial. Myra Crosby then explained that she was a member of the jury for the trial. [REDACTED] John Crosby, and Myra Crosby then began having a brief discussion about the case and what the outcome of the trial would be. Myra Crosby then said that she was not sure if Alex Murdaugh "did it" or she "didn't think he (Alex Murdaugh) did it." He also thought Myra Crosby may have said something to the effect of, "I (Myra Crosby) don't think he is guilty." Myra Crosby did not talk about what she had observed in the trial. John Crosby did not mention anything about the trial to [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] noted that the conversation was "very brief," and that Myra Crosby and John Crosby were at his residence approximately 30 to 45 minutes. He did not discuss the trial or the conversation with Myra Crosby with anyone other than [REDACTED]. Additionally, he did not tell anyone that Myra Crosby was a member of the jury.

The interview concluded at approximately 9:39 p.m.
